



University of Miyazaki (Miyazaki Prefecture)



Students will study their specialized fields under the guidance of their advisor. They may also visit local schools to experience directly how the Japanese education system works.

◇ University overview

The University of Miyazaki is a national university consisting of five faculties (Education, Medicine, Engineering, Agriculture, and Regional Innovation) and seven graduate schools. Teacher Training students are admitted to the Graduate School of Education.

◇ Outline and characteristics of the course for Teacher Training Students

○ Characteristics of the program

- Students will study their specialized fields and audit the classes of their specialized fields and of Japanese language under the guidance of their advisor.
- Students could participate in field trips and Japanese local internship. They will have opportunities to study with Japanese students.

○ Number of students to be accepted: no more than 3

○ Outline of the course

After six months' Japanese language education at another institution in Japan, students will study at the in-service teacher training program at the University of Miyazaki for one year.

- Students will study their specialized fields under the guidance of their advisor.
- Students have to submit the report on their research by the end of February 2023.
- Students could audit the classes of their specialized fields and Japanese language classes under the guidance of their advisor. (They cannot get credits for the classes they audit.)
- Students could have opportunities to visit elementary and secondary schools and take part in cultural exchange activities with pupils at these schools.

◇ Follow-up for graduates

Advisors keep in touch with their former students through SNS. A follow-up to courses may be offered at the discretion of advisors.
